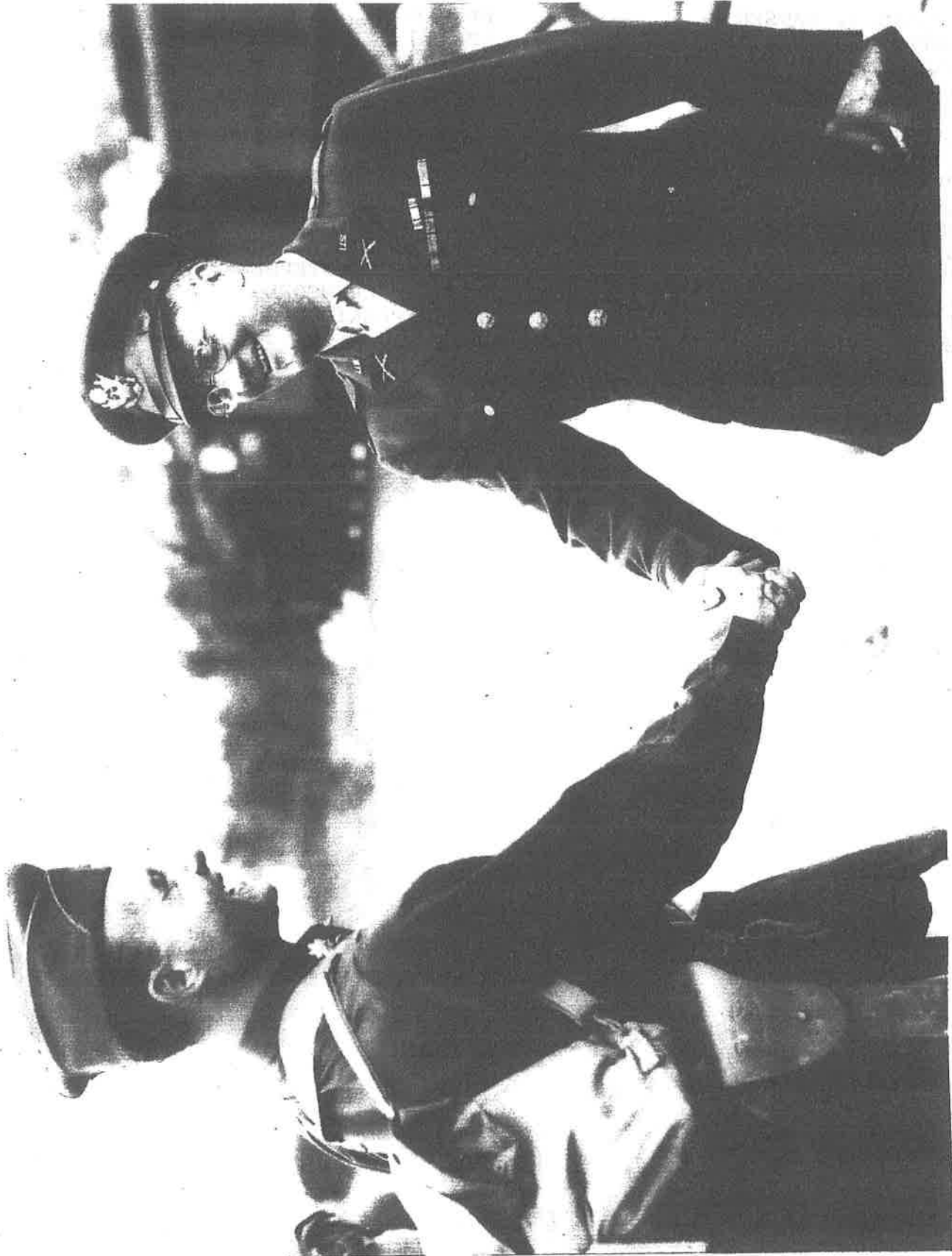

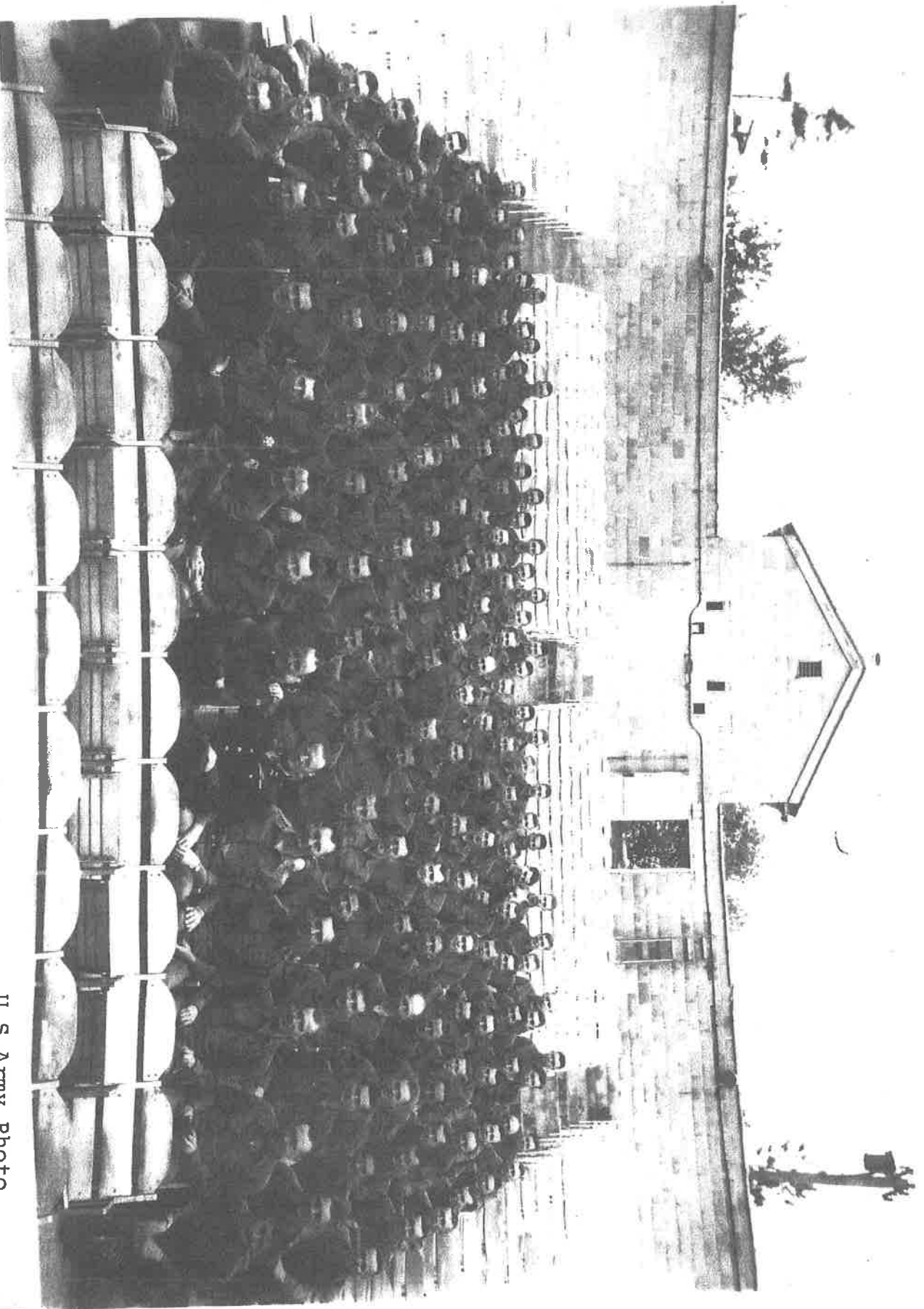

Melvin Bradshaw was a reliable mail clerk.

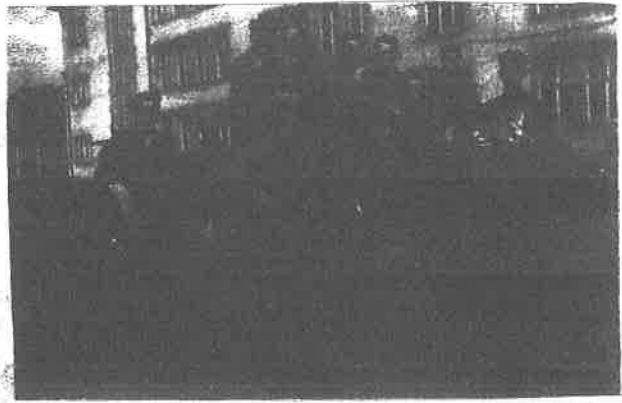
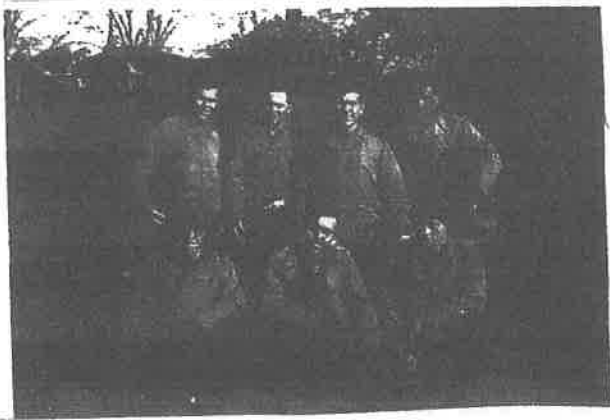
Joe Bitting and Art Boron were the meteorologists.
